1- Project Report

a) Loisiijo Foot Bridge

In August 2011 three young Masai warriors disappeared trying to cross the Ewaso Ngiro River, they were washed away by the flooding waters and believed to be drowned. Together with Harmon Parker of the NGO 'Bridging the Gap', it was decided to go ahead with building the foot bridge across the river without waiting for funding. Bridging the Gap, went ahead with the work commencing early October and the bridge was finished by the end of November 2011.



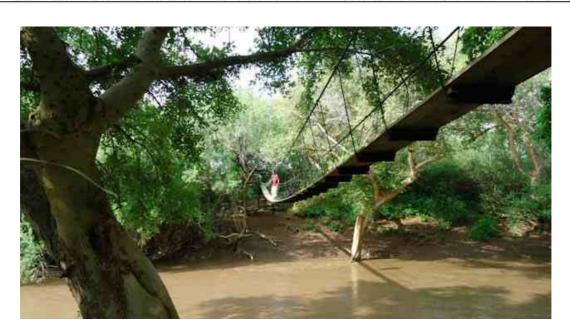

b) Loisiijo Hot Water Project

Improvements to Loisiijo Lodge will increase visitors numbers which will improve revenue to the Shompole Group Ranch community. 'Hot water' seems to be a regular comment on the visitors book, since in this warm climate we currently provide only cold water for showers. So it was decided to start implementing a design provided by Mr Bruce Boyd, to create a cheap hot water solar system directly connected to one of the main water tanks of the lodge.



Loisiijo Solar Hot Water System

In October and December, a plumber was taken to Loisiijo lodge. 150 m trench was dug And a 32 mm HDPE pipe was laid and connected from the water tank to the four bungalows. New hot and cold water mixers were also connected to the showers in the four bathrooms. It is a closed circuit, part of it is external and exposed to the sun. A Solar circulation pump will move the hot water in the pipes. By the evening warm water will be available in quantity.

c) Siloam Orphanage

Situated in Kibera the Orphanage currently takes care of 72 orphans and over 450 day students. We have been supporting the orphanage by supplying them with basic food items like maize, beans etc. on a regular monthly basis. We are also paying for the Kenya School examination fees for the orphans, and occasionally take the orphans on outings to the Nairobi National Park. The orphanage is also supported by a few other individuals.

d)Todonyang Internally Displaced People

While on film work in the very north of Kenya at the border with Ethiopia and Sudan, Michel Laplace-Toulouse met and filmed a Turkana community who had been displaced from their grazing area by tribal clashes. Over several days the film crew got to know the Turkana village. Some weeks later we learned in the newspaper that on 10/03/2011 13 people were killed by the Merille tribe from Ethiopia. Amongst them was one of the women we had filmed. Michel immediately organised a collection to help out the family. 120,000- Kenya Shillings were collected and the cash was handed over to the Area Chief, Daniel Lochomin and Father Cosmas the local respected Catholic Priest on the families behalf, to build a boat to allow the family to start a new business fishing on the Lake Turkana.

2-2012 Projections

- Loisiijo Lodge / Shompole Group Ranch.

- 1) 366000- Ksh are still owed to Bridging the Gap for Bridge construction.
- 2) Funding from African Conservation Center (ACC) had been allocated for repairs of the roof of the lodge, unfortunately this has now been dropped as payment has been reallocated by ACC to pay salaries of the Shompole Conservancy Game Rangers for the next few months, since they considered this an urgent priority.

2,000,000-ksh (2million) is now needed to repair the roof. It is becoming a serious issue due to rapid deterioration and now Loisiijo is the only operational lodge in the area. If the lodge has to close because of the state of the roof, the loss of revenue might jeopardize the existence of the Shompole Wildlife Conservancy. ACC's commitment may not be renewed either.

3) Hot water system

Only the solar pump is missing. We are currently sourcing the appropriate pump, as there is no suitable pump available in Kenya at the moment. 52798-ksh or 500€ are currently available for it.

Monthly minimum needed currently is 42000-ksh X 12 = 504.000/. or 5000 €

Siloam Orphanage's needs are expected to increase, as Kenya's inflation rate in February 2012 was at 16,69%. A 20% increase in budget could significantly help the Orphanage for 2012.

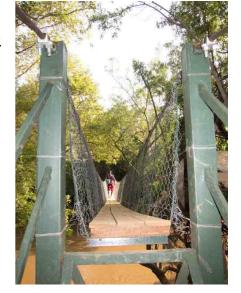

Bridging the Gap Africa

Bridging the Gap Africa is a non-profit charity that assists rural community's to build bridges over rivers that pose dangers. BTGA has built close to 50 simple hanging footbridges in isolated regions in Kenya over the last 15 years; they are helping hundreds of thousands of Kenyans every day. BTGA has many requests from communities all over Kenya and at the moment is not able to meet the demanding need due to lack of funding. It is important to understand that BTGA is NOT a contracting company, but a charity that works side by side with communities to build their bridge, and a trained contractor, Sylvester Ouko of Fortune Fabricators (who works with BTGA).

Loisiijo Community Bridge Request

Michel Laplace-Toulouse, with African Latitude, contacted Harmon Parker, BTGA founder and director requesting a bridge to help the community at Loisiijo lodge. Due to Michel's persistence and patience, Harmon finally agreed to visit the potential bridge site on June 19th, 2011 and determined that this request qualifies for BTGA's assistance in building a bridge.

On August 31st, Harmon brought professional bridge engineer from the US, Kelley Rehm, to survey the bridge site at Loisiijo and to meet with Michel and Shompole Group Ranch leaders. Attending this meeting were Mr. Shanni Ole Patenya (Development Coordinator), Mr Isaac Kiresian (Group Chairman), the local chief and elders representing the community.

Harmon committed to build the bridge for the community in late November 2011 with the community's assistance and to present an estimate of the related costs to construct the bridge by October 1st, 2011. Pictures of BTGA's standard suspended bridge were shown to the leadership via computer and they found this type of bridge to be acceptable.

Loisiijo Footbridge Proposal

Loisiijoi Community Requirements

BTGA has guidelines when working with rural communities and a methodology that has been developed over the years. There are 3 aspects to this methodology:

- 1. The Community must initiate the project
- 2. The Community must participate in the project by providing labor and contribute financially towards the costs involved in constructing a bridge.
- 3. The Community must take ownership of the bridge once it's completed and be responsible for inevitable repairs in the future.

It's been proven when a community invests financially towards their bridge, the bridge will be well taken care of and the leaders ensure the bridge is not misused.

Funding for the Loisiijo Footbridge

During discussion with the Loisiijo leadership and Michel, Harmon shared that BTGA did not have funding to build the requested bridge, but would contribute technical assistance, wire rope and Harmon's time and expertise. Michel committed to raise a portion of the funds overseas through his contacts and the community would contribute as well. The cost of the bridge was not discussed because Harmon wanted to put together an estimate to present to the committee by October 1st, 2011.

Estimated Costs for the Loisiijo 40 meter Footbridge

Total Bridge Cost 1,091,250/ksh
BTGA Contribution - 472,180/ksh
Total Funds Needed 619,070/ksh

Bridge Construction Schedule

The bridge will be constructed in two different phases:

Concrete and steel foundations: 8 – 16 October 2011
 Attaching wire rope, decking and steps: 29 Nov – 2 Dec 2011

The Way Forward

BTGA is now in the progress of fabricating the bridge parts for the Loisiijo footbridge in Kitale. Due to Harmon's very busy work schedule, the dates to build the bridge should be agreed on, if the bridge is to be built this year.

The Shompole Group Ranch Committee must work out the funding details with Michel. It is recommended that the committee's contribution be 200,000/ksh and that Michel's organization raises the remaining amount.

Although it would be more ideal if the community had more time to process this proposal, this is not possible (if the bridge is be built this year). Therefore, all parties must agree on the conditions laid out in this proposal by October 2, 2011.

The funding for this project shall be sent by bank wire transfer to BTGA's office in Bowling Green, Ohio and designated as a donation towards Loisiijo Footbridge. Details will be provided once the agreement is approved.
